Introduction

The 2nd Unconventional Gas International Conference and Exhibition was held September 29 – October 1, 2009 at the Fort Worth Convention Center in Fort Worth, Texas, USA. The event featured conference content ranging from trends in unconventional gas production to advancements in recovery methods. The exhibition featured a range of products and services used in the unconventional gas industry. This dedicated event brought attendees and exhibitors together to network and exchange ideas in an open forum.

Event highlights:

- 342 attendees from 14 different countries including Algeria, Argentina, Australia, Canada, France, Germany, India, Indonesia, Mexico, Nigeria, Romania, Russian Federation, United Kingdom and United States

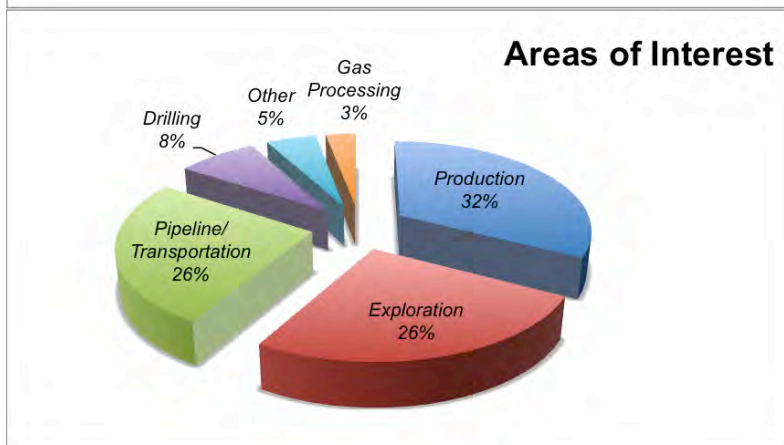
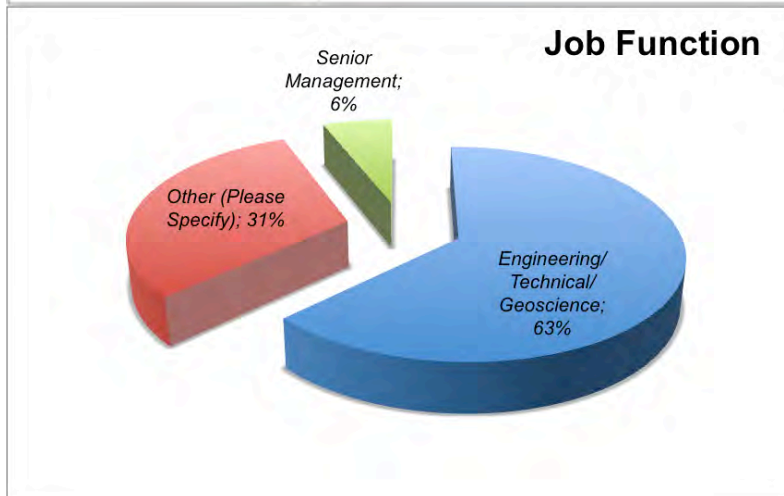
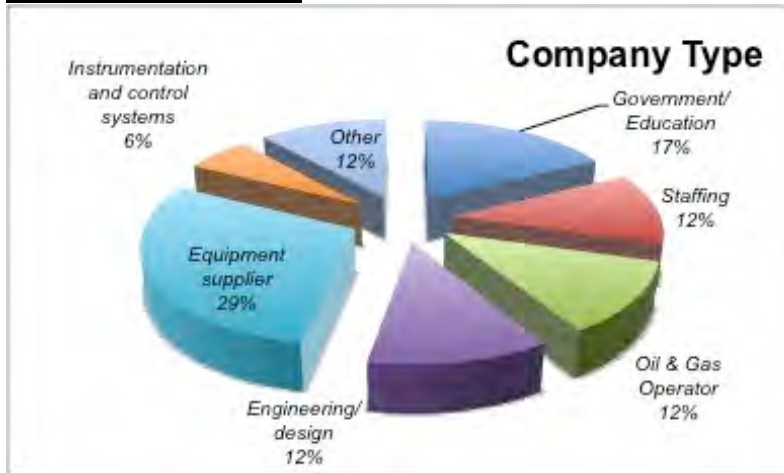

Technical Conference

The 2nd Unconventional Gas International conference officially commenced with an opening session from Conference Director, Bob Tippee, *Oil & Gas Journal*. Mr. Tippee welcomed delegates, thanked sponsors and introduced the three keynote speakers.

Dr. Stephen A. Holditch's opening keynote presented new developments in the stimulation of tight gas reservoirs. Jim Baird's presentation focused on SEC reserve reporting, and Vello A. Kuuskraa discussed the changing perceptions of international unconventional supplies.

Delegates attended sessions focused on trends in unconventional gas production as well as technical sessions geared towards specific recovery methods. Sessions also covered the future of crude oil and natural gas markets, understanding government noise regulations, fracturing processes, using microseismic monitoring and more.

The conference advisory board organized a technical program with seven sessions that included two panel discussions. Session 1 was titled, The Turnaround: When? What Follows?, and focused on trends in the industry and government regulations. Other sessions included papers presented on the topic of Plays and Technologies: What's Viable. In panel discussions, members spoke of what recovery will look like and of what technologies will improve economics.

Many delegates mentioned the value of covering unconventional gas topics in a forum that allows for the free exchange of ideas. They also remarked as to the importance of the exhibition to allow for networking and researching new products and services.
